GOVERNOR APPOINTS SCOTT YOUNG TO SUPERIOR COURT JUDGE

NAPA, CA. Governor Edmund G. Brown, Jr. announced today the appointment of Scott R. L. Young to a judgeship in the Napa Superior Court. He fills the vacancy created by the recent conversion of a vacant commissioner position to a judgeship.

The Governor's Office released the following statement:

Scott R. L. Young, 39, of Napa, has been appointed to a judgeship in the Napa County Superior Court. Young has served as a commissioner at the Napa County Superior Court since 2018. He served as a deputy district attorney at the Napa County District Attorney's Office from 2017 to 2018 and from 2007 to 2014. Young served as a deputy district attorney at the Orange County District Attorney's Office from 2014 to 2017 and was a sole practitioner from 2005 to 2007. He earned a Juris Doctor degree from the University of the Pacific, McGeorge School of Law and a Bachelor of Science degree from Southern Oregon University. He fills the vacancy created by the conversion of a court commissioner position on December 13, 2018. Young is a Democrat.

"I am thrilled to welcome Scott as a superior court judge to our bench. He has served the court with distinction since joining as a commissioner earlier this year and will make an outstanding judge. We are grateful that the Governor appointed Mr. Young at this critical time for our court as we strive to provide access to justice to the people of Napa County," said Presiding Judge Elia Ortiz.

Mr. Young added, "It has been an honor to serve Napa County both as a court commissioner and as a deputy district attorney. I am now looking forward to building on these efforts as a superior court judge."
